Patient Testing

Patients who are double vaccinated and meet the Covid-19 screening questions are exempt from providing a negative Covid-19 test before any treatment or clinic appointment.

Patients who have **not** had two Covid-19 vaccinations will:

- need to meet the Covid-19 screening questionnaire
- wear an N95 mask,
- provide a negative Covid-19 test or have a rapid antigen test on arrival prior to each weekly visit at the Medical Services Building. If they are attending more than one appointment in the same week, then one negative test prior to their first appointment is sufficient.

Support People – Medical Services Building

During treatments there is continued focus on minimising visitors in shared spaces.

When a patient requests a support person during treatments this will be approved by the individual oncologist.

Clinic appointments

First Specialist Appointment - one support person allowed.

- If fully vaccinated they must meet the screening questionnaire and wear an N95 mask.
- If unvaccinated they must meet the screening questionnaire, wear an N95 and provide a negative Covid-19 test at arrival if unable to get this at Rako Science as not local then RAT to be performed at arrival by nursing staff.

Follow up clinics

Follow up scan results to be discussed – one support person allowed.

Patient has physical limitations (hearing or vision impairment, reduced mobility) or psychological distress – one support person allowed

Follow up phone consultations will be made where possible to minimise the amount of people entering the building.

All support people must meet the Covid-19 screening questions and wear an N95 mask.
